


OFF ROAD

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
Mathinna





The group jumped back into the vehicles and trip Leader Mark Templar took us to Waterfall number 2 the Cam falls where we aired down in the buzzy filled paddock.








Trout and Brian's vehicles fired up early to head out, with three vehicles staying and heading out after lunch, Kurt with a broken mirror on the way out.

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
