Perhaps the most excitement of the day was when the 11 women in the field of 41 took the wheel and showed the men a thing or two.

Fay Popowski had the crowd heading for cover when she finished her run on the wrong side of the finishing post, after nearly cleaning it up. Elaine Ollington's knees were reported to have been still shaking an hour after her turn.

Peter "Driftwood" West-

brook was determined not to get bogged on his second assault on the course, and took a different approach, but still only managed to get a little further than his first try.

Organisers said the feedback from the event had been very pleasing, with a good crowd on hand to witness the action.

The run attracted competitors from as far away as Launceston, with the majority of coastal entrants from Devonport, with the APPM dispute affecting the entries from Burnie.

Organisers offered a special thankyou to co-commentators Bill Templar and Graeme Birtwistle, time keepers Greg and Damien Frankcombe, starter Geoff Saville, Duncan Sayer and Bill Bramich on the tow rope, Graeme Ollington on tractor and Kevin Blake, chief towing foreman.
