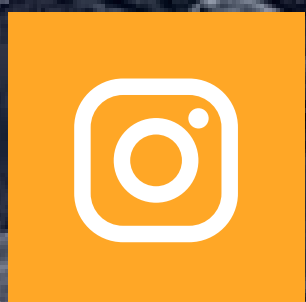

## Defib for public use stolen from 4WD club

CONFUSION and disap-  
pointment is being felt at  
Sassafras after a community  
defibrillator was stolen  
from the outside wall of  
the Devonport 4WD Club  
headquarters.

The defibrillator was  
installed for free, emergency  
use by the community with  
grants from Ambulance Tas-  
mania (AT) and the Latrobe  
Council before being ripped  
off sometime before the  
weekend.

Club president Lyndon  
Kettle said he was unsure  
why someone would steal  
a defibrillator, as it was not  
clear what value it could  
have for anyone who was  
not experiencing medi-  
cal distress.

"The inspiration for having  
it installed was a mate of  
mine who had an issue," Mr  
Kettle said.

"If it wasn't for a defibrilla-  
tor he would have died."

He said they had regis-  
tered this one with the AT  
app, which allows people  
to see where such tools are  
available for use.

Police said it was believed  
the defibrillator had been  
stolen at some point in July,  
and that Latrobe officers  
were investigating.

## **2022 / 2023**

The second and ongoing achievement, that is also Michael Kerr's baby, is gaining permission for the installation of a mobile phone booster on top of the Sandy Cape lighthouse, this project is well underway and plans to be completed in December.

The president of another club once said to me that the most important job is the newsletter editor, and I agree, thankyou Andrew Wilson for the great work on the newsletter, and of course the rest of the club executive, Stephen Holman, Sarina Reid, Michaela Redpath, David Redpath and the rest of the 2022/23 committee members.

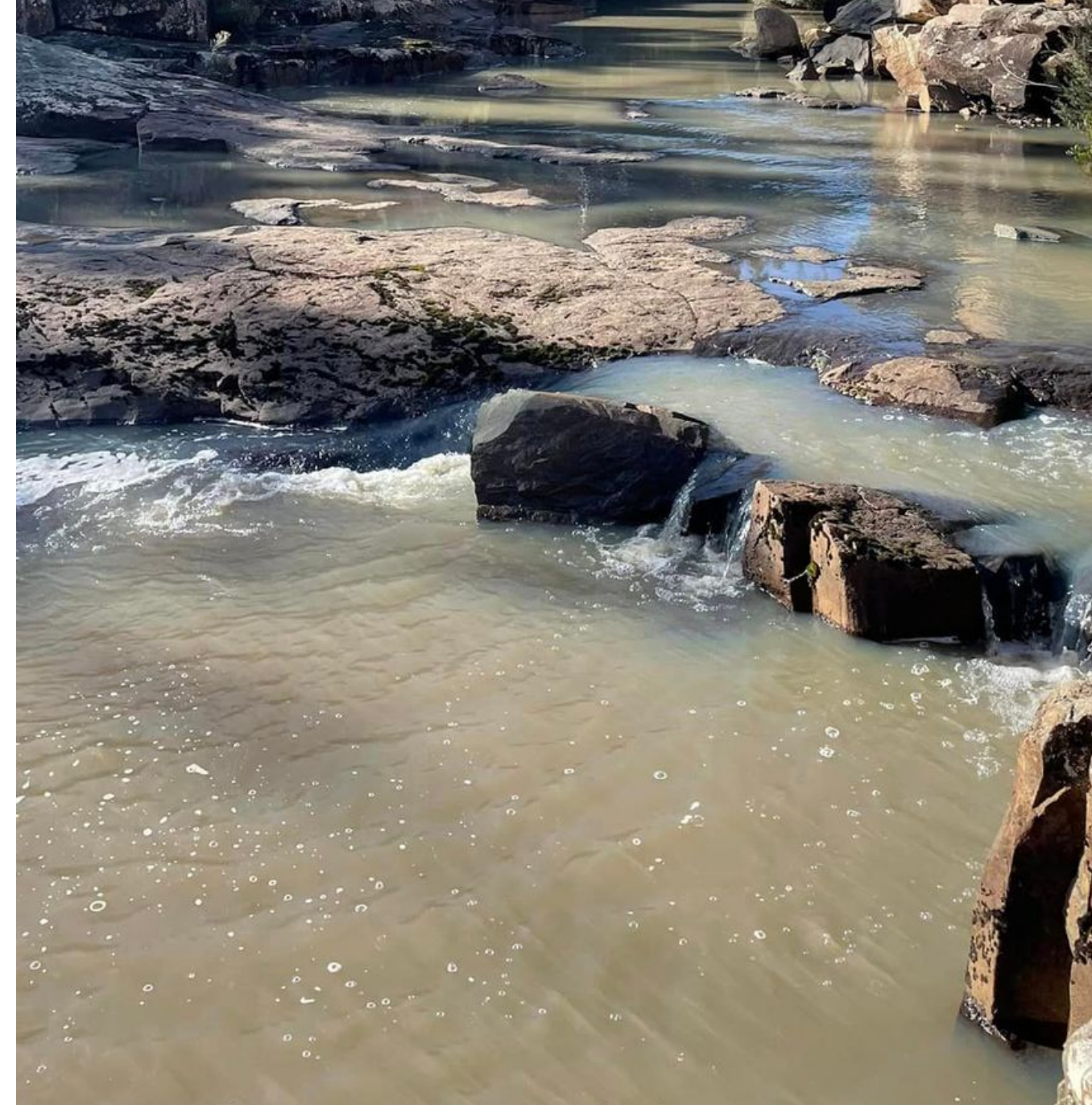
As Mark had never had the pleasure of going to The Lake Leake Hotel , we made a detour, had a beer and watched a bit of the soccer replay.

Was a very relaxing and enjoyable trip and a big thanks to Mark's brother Paul for letting us stay at his home .







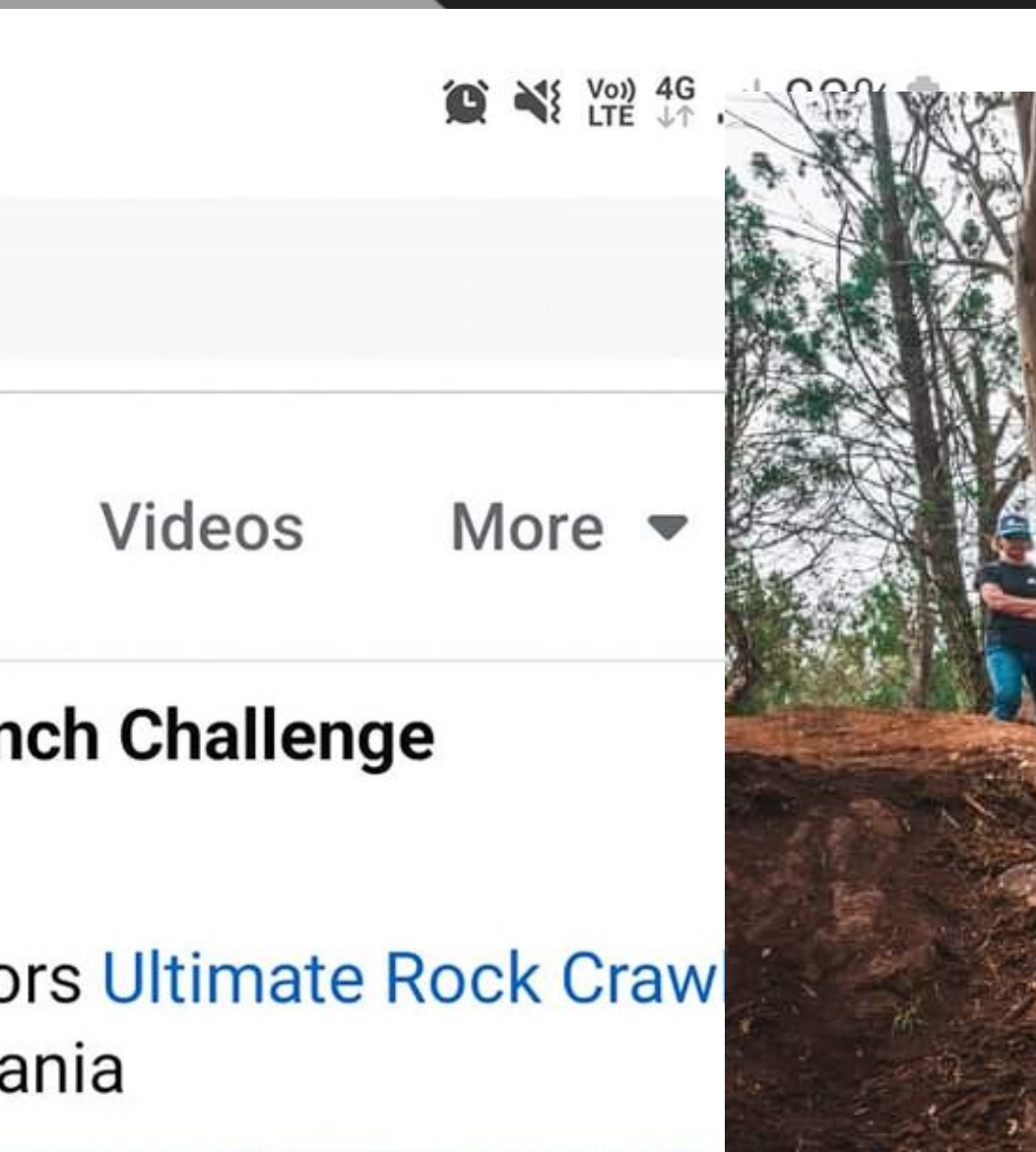
